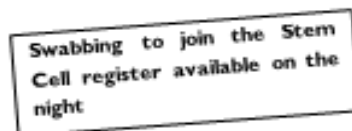

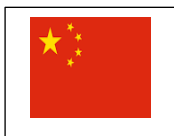

Library news

We are fast approaching our first anniversary so we wanted to give an update of what's happened in the last year. Here are some statistics for you all.....

We had just over 1700 books when the library was opened.

We now have 3573 (!) books active on our system.

During that time we have had to remove 148 books from our system because they have been lost or damaged.

Since September we have purchased 863 books.

This means that we have had donations of more than 1000 books from yourselves and publishers that have supported us. For that a huge Thank You!!!

It's been a wonderful start to our library, but it is an ongoing venture that is always in need of your support. Our goal is to have around 4500 books available for our children to borrow, so all good quality donations are always appreciated.
